UBC co-chairs called the meeting to order at approximately 10:05 A.M.

Agenda topic # 1 - Welcome from Co-Chairs and Agenda review

• Jeff Wilson and Amy Sueyoshi welcomed committee members and guests.

Agenda reviewed, guests reminded of the ways to contact UBC including Office Hours

Agenda topic # 2 - Member roll call

Quorum established.

Agenda topic # 3 - Approval of minutes from Sept. 19, 2024 UBC meeting

• Minutes approved as submitted.

Agenda topic # 4 - President's Message

- President Mahoney acknowledged the 260+ people in the room. Thanked everyone for their efforts to reduce
 costs towards campus resizing. Expenses have been reduced by millions but now on the 3rd year of unfunded
 mandates, the most important is employee compensation. Increases negotiated recently were overdue but still
 insufficient, and the State still hasn't funded compensation nor rising costs of health benefits.
- Campus is working very hard to improve enrollment. Despite this, challenges remain to resize to a smaller university, which has already happened due to enrollment decline. Historic underfunding of the CSU as a public institution has been happening for years. The CSU Board of Trustees was forced to increase tuition to help close the growing budget deficit, but costs continue to rise particularly for campuses in NorCal.
- NorCal campuses face another threat now: as of last week, the latest '25-'26 California budget proposes another 7.95% funding cut for the CSU. CSU negotiated with unions in good faith of the Governor's promise to keep the CSU Compact with the State of California. Although fulfilling part of it, the rest is no longer certain.
- President and CFO are in extensive talks with the CO. Once the Governor releases his budget in January, if the funding reduction remains in place, CSU may reconsider the 5% enrollment-target allocation (funding) reduction to this campus, but no promises have been made.

- It's most important everyone share accurate facts with colleagues and students. Students believe they're paying more tuition but have fewer courses. There are fewer courses because of a decline of nearly 8,000 students. Fewer students = fewer classes, which comes at great cost to lecturer faculty. Students should be assured that campus downsizing does not mean they won't have the classes they need to graduate; they will. Asked all to help explain the tuition increase was driven by decades of CA disinvestment in public higher education.
- The latest Governor's 7.95% cut in funding means serving current students with far less funding. This will have significant impact. The CSU is receiving less than the UCs and California Community Colleges (CCC).
- The CSU has doubled graduation rates for all students, but equity and opportunity gaps remain. The funding cuts will jeopardize this success. Unions and labor are powerful forces in CA and their support is needed. The Chancellor is ready to fight the funding cuts and needs others to fight as well.
- Mari Hulick shared her department held a letter-writing event to CA Senators and others outside her dept. also attended. Stressed that more activities are needed to gather support.
- President Mahoney will work with Academic Affairs and Student Affairs to help get students active also.
- Aaron White commented even with less students overall, some colleges have not had the same enrollment
 decline but funding cuts are affecting all areas. Differing from what the President stated that there are enough
 courses for current students, in CoSE they've reduced classes so less courses available for their students in Spring.
- President Mahoney replied the courses needed to graduate are priority. Agreed there may be disparities as some departments are smaller than others, and some may be more stable. Provost is working with Deans as she does not get involved in their college budget decisions. It's possible there are difficult decisions that haven't been made yet, or can't be made about protecting smaller departments by making cuts to larger departments. These are the kinds of conversations happening between the Provost and the Deans.
- Encouraged transparency at the colleges and conversations with departments to help everyone understand. Some curriculum was designed when majors were large with ability to offer lots of electives. With less students/less funding, curriculum has to be reexamined and redesigned for current student enrollment. Some courses can be reduced to allow more space for required courses. Downsizing will change the way things are done, but it will not affect the courses students need to graduate.
- **Genie Stowers** echoed advocacy efforts are needed, and suggested having a weekly hour-of-action via Zoom, sharing legislative names/addresses for letters and calling representatives during that hour, which can have enormous impact as their offices receive many calls at the same time.
- Having this many attendees at budget meetings helps creates a shared understanding of what's happening. Everyone is in this together and must work together to be effective. Reminded everyone funding cuts affect everyone and although she understands the frustration felt, it should be directed at the right people.
- **Chanda Jensen** reiterated the need for shared support and not working against one another. Asked for positive talking points to help explain to students how they are still supported, so that can be utilized when needed.
- David Miller Shevelev shared his experience on the topic of legislative advocacy; when he interned at the Assembly, template letter-writing was seen as the least effective because they're easiest to reply in multi-letter format. More significant is attending hearings and meeting with members directly, since those take the most amount of time for legislators to respond to.
- **President Mahoney** stated Presidents will be in Sacramento in the Spring meeting with legislators directly. Reminded everyone the head of the Senate budget committee is Senator Scott Wiener, who is local to SF.
- No further questions received.

Agenda topic # 5 - SF State Enrollment Update

- **Katie lynch** noting the articles shared in the Chat, remarked undergraduate enrollment as a whole is declining nationally due to a demographic decline of undergraduate students.

Agenda topic # 6 - VSIP Clarification

- Jeff Wilson commented this presentation clarifies the <u>Sept 2024 VSIP presentation</u> offered by Ingrid Williams.
- (see slides)
- Jackson Wilson asked if \$9.7M assumes none of the positions will be rehired, after filling any essential positions.
- **Jeff Wilson** replied it represents the benefits and salary savings for all participants, but if critical positions need to be rehired, agreed it would lower that amount.
- **Genie Stowers** shared a question posted to the Chat asking if those positions are being discontinued.
- **Jeff Wilson** replied the intent was to eliminate those positions, but critical positions need to be replaced and it's up to the VP's of each division to determine which will be refilled and which can be permanently eliminated.
- Alesha Sohler asked about other positions, not only those affected by VSIP: if someone leaves, what happens to that position.
- **Jeff Wilson** responded it's the same strategy the campus is in a hiring chill. The President has to approve rehiring any position so the VPs will determine if the position is critical or not. As an example, the ITS security administrator is a critical position at this time of high data security of student data, so that position must be filled.
- No further questions received.

Agenda topic # 7 - 2024-2025 Budget Update

- Jeff Wilson commented there haven't been many changes to the '24-'25 operating budget since Sept. meeting.
- (see slides)
- **Danny Paz Gabriner** asked if this budget is aligned with the updated enrollment projections.
- **Elena Stoian** replied her office doesn't typically go back to update, but quarterly financial reviews project the performance of the budget to determine where they'll be at year-end. They are currently working on updating revenue and expenditures based on enrollment projections. Updated consolidated and capital budgets will be published at <u>budget.sfsu.edu</u> under Transparency and Accountability.
- **Genie Stowers** asked if the increases shown on the slide with the <u>breakdown by units</u> is attributed to salary increases (Student Affairs & Enrollment Management, University Advancement and Office of the President).
- **Jeff Wilson** responded it's a large part but they had allocations from the CO for specific programs (i.e., NAGPRA, Title IX and Basic Needs for students, Foundation support for university fundraising).
- **Chanda Jensen** requested clarification; budget scenario planning already included projected enrollment decline and the deficit already existed, so there wouldn't be many changes to the '24-'25 budget.
- Elena Stoian explained her office ran a few iterations of the '24-'25 budget in its final stages, as some changes are additional to the plan. They're now reviewing the impact of current Fall enrollment and Spring '25 projections.
- No further questions received.

Agenda topic #8 - 2025-2026 Budget Update

- **Jeff Wilson** presented '25-'26 budget-planning. Although still in early stages of planning, changes could occur over the next few months.
- (see slides)
- Chanda Jenson asked if reserves will be depleted as of this '24-'25 budget cycle, or will any be left for AY '25-'26.
- **Jeff Wilson** responded based on current planning, there is no plan to have central reserves for '25-'26. There may be some carryforwards and balances available to address a portion of the deficit in the divisions, but there are no central reserves available based on current forecasts.
- **Danny Paz Gabriner** inquired if the 5% divisional reductions are already included in the current plan or if that's still to happen. Also if the CO reallocation reduction is based on this year or next.

- **Jeff Wilson** acknowledged the 5% reduction has been planned but has not been accomplished yet. The CSU target allocation reduction is based on enrollment target vs. actual enrollment for '24-'25.
- **Genie Stowers** commented about reductions to supplies budgets as discussed in Chat; noted 90% of the budget is in salaries with everything else 10%. Things have to balance, as costs like utilities continue to rise. As a service organization, most of the budget is in salaries and she expressed concern about some of the strategies made at college levels which don't seem strategic enough to keep departments moving forward.
- Mari Hulick noted a department like Facilities had 18 staff take VSIP, but it didn't solve the problem. While it
 seems easy to decrease classes, release lecturers, reduce instructional equipment budgets, it isn't going to
 achieve the balance needed nor does it seem strategic. Reiterated the need for a new vision suggests all colleges
 come together to help plan a vision for resizing the campus.
- **Jeff Wilson** confirmed her comments, adding UBC should be included in those discussions.
- **Aaron White** reiterated the need for vision, asked the President / Provost where they see the campus in 5 years.
- **David Hellman** asked for transparency on where cuts have happened and which programs are working on it. Has only seen broad budget numbers and would like to see more detail. Also suggested review of telephone services on campus that is no longer be needed, such as the softphones on employee laptops, to save money.
- **Jeff Wilson** confirmed there's a plan to minimize some services, and phones are an example. A survey will be conducted to determine where phones is required. No phones will be deactivated without consultation.
- **David Schachman** asked about the enrollment projections; the enrollment decline is noted at 3% for next year but last six months showed a 6% enrollment decline.
- **Jeff Wilson** replied 3% is what's currently projected but if higher, then adjustments to this plan will be made.
- Amy Sueyoshi added there will be an enrollment update in January.
- **Katie Lynch** added 3% is how far off from the projections the campus was at end of Fall census from original projections the budget was based on. Her team is monitoring Spring closely.
- No further questions received.

Agenda topic # 9 - What Other CSU's are Doing

- Amy Sueyoshi remarked UBC was asked what other CSU campuses are doing to reduce costs in Academic Affairs. She surveyed received information about some of the levers being pulled to reduce costs.

- Lori Beth Way added several majors are in process of reducing units; (Senate just approved Philosophy's units).
- Mary Menees asked about reducing assigned time, as has been implemented at other universities.
- Amy Sueyoshi confirmed Sutee is working on an assigned time report to present. All levers are being considered.
- Many Menees asked if layoffs at SF State are being considered.
- Amy Sueyoshi said layoffs are currently not being considered.
- **Mike Goldman** asked if those campuses discussed offering more online education to increase enrollment. Also noted other campuses are not all considering unit reductions in their majors and shared concern if that may not be as cost-effective, and if it may hurt curricular offerings.
- Amy Sueyoshi replied some campuses offered online degrees prior to and during the pandemic, and while some boosted enrollment (i.e., Ethnic Studies at East Bay), campuses noted online degrees are not necessarily great for their student population, as on this campus. They're looking at retention to boost enrollment. Unit reductions in majors are under consideration at some campuses although they may not have started yet. Declines in faculty are causing curriculum redesign that may include unit reductions in some majors. Hasn't researched yet if some of SF State's degrees may have a larger number of units than others, but in general, reducing units will save money.
- Alaric Trousdale asked about combining colleges at some campuses listed and why they're not considering.
- Amy Sueyoshi replied combining colleges without using other levers does not save much money, if they're not also reviewing curriculum and degree programs also. East Bay will be combining their Graduate College of

Education; it will become a school, but they will retain their director. SF State has gone through combining colleges and is unsure if it saved money compared to the organizational trauma it caused.

- **Genie Stowers** agreed it didn't save much but caused alot of trauma.
- No further questions received.

Agenda topic # 10 - Public Forum

- **Danny Paz Gabriner** stated during the multi-year planning he understood there would be a focus on faculty reductions over the first two years and in year three, there may be plans for staff reductions. If layoffs are not being considered, at what point did that change, and for how long.
- Amy Sueyoshi responded she can't say for how long, due to the Governor's budget proposal in January. In Academic Affairs they've looked at instructional costs and college staffing. Nearly all colleges submitted their plans with staff reductions, mostly due to attrition reorgs are planned.
- **Jackson Wilson** remarked as cost-savings options are discussed, it may be useful to have dollar estimates in order to consider which levers may have larger or fewer savings.
- Amy Sueyoshi said everything is being considered, as all other campuses are trying everything as well. Even campuses with high enrollment are looking at cost-savings and some layoffs. Requested John Kim may be able to add numbers to see what levers would be most effective. Some savings can be smaller but combined, can help (such as reducing water coolers as there are water refill stations all over campus, and adding more self-service options; due to high staff loss in Facilities, offices in the Administration are removing their own trash/recycling).
- **Genie Stowers** agreed all details need to be reviewed and strategies should be categorized as having immediate or long-term impact. Degree reduction has long-term impact, and immediate impact strategies are needed.
- Mari Hulick added a transition design framework is needed. First step should be identifying a clear vision to what/where to transition to, how to get there and how to prioritize SF State's position in the Bay Area. The SF State Strategic Plan is vague and there's no mention of right-sizing. The CSU has to look at its 23-campus size, where some campuses are close to one another. SF State has an opportunity to position its place in the Bay Area, when it's reached its right-size and identified its value. Added there's a lot of expertise and talent on campus. Assigned time is very valuable and they might be able to help if released vs. hiring outside consultants. Town Halls, a university-wide conversation and ideas are needed to get started.
- Aaron White noted on the CSU-comparison slides, there's a "no" next to layoffs, but reducing classes are functionally layoffs for lecturers. Some have lost their jobs as they have no classes to teach in Spring. Asked Provost for her interpretation of right-sized, and her vision for the university.
- Amy Sueyoshi responded although she can't predict how many students will enroll at SF State in future years, reminded that strategic visions are created through shared governance. Any vision shared by leadership will be a collaborative one, and one that everyone, including the Academic Senate, can agree with in consultation with campus constituents. The strategic plan is still relevant; it was drafted before reductions had to be considered but still represents campus core values. This includes attracting and retaining students to provide them with an education that may not have been accessible, and a transformative curriculum to change lives. The strategic plan is not a guide to making reductions. Departments should be considering where their future is; i.e., Humanities. CLCA is working on figuring this out and there are experts in the room to help decide where that field is going.
- Sandee Noda commented on legislative advocacy; in her former role with the CSUEU they were advised to go to legislative town halls. It's disappointing when campus members don't go, as that's an opportunity to get facetime with your legislature to discuss SF State. Also commented about layoffs: temporary hires are laid off with only 2-week notice, and there are about 100 temporary staff on campus currently.
- **Jeff Wilson** remarked the multi-year budget plan was developed with a commitment to no-layoffs. It was known the VSIP wasn't going to be large enough to solve the budget problem, but it was part of the plan to help align resources and costs. The numbers presented today, including the \$21M reduction in State funding along with the unfunded compensation costs that are committed to but do not have funding sources, completely changed the

financial plan and strategies to address the deficits. Stated he cannot confirm layoffs will not happen at SF State. Everything has to be discussed with the numbers presented today. It's not known what has to be done until the Governor's budget proposal is received in January. Also, the strategic plan does not mention downsizing but Priority #5 is about aligning resources with costs.

- John Kim added he was surprised at the \$35.2M deficit noted at the last UBC meeting. Things have changed as far as projections and information from the CO about the State reduction and even though still significant, a \$28.6M deficit seems somewhat better.
- **Jeff Wilson** replied with additional guidance from the CO the calculations were different, and it had not been taken into account the net tuition increase less the enrollment decline, which came out to approx. \$7M.
- **Danny Paz Gabriner** asked to clarify if the deficit is the 5% reduction plan plus the \$28.6M.
- **Jeff Wilson** replied the \$28.6M deficit takes into account the State reduction, the reallocation plan, tuition increase and forecasted expenditures. The '25-'26 was a high-level preview; the Budget office will prepare a forecast to be used for planning.
- No further questions asked.
